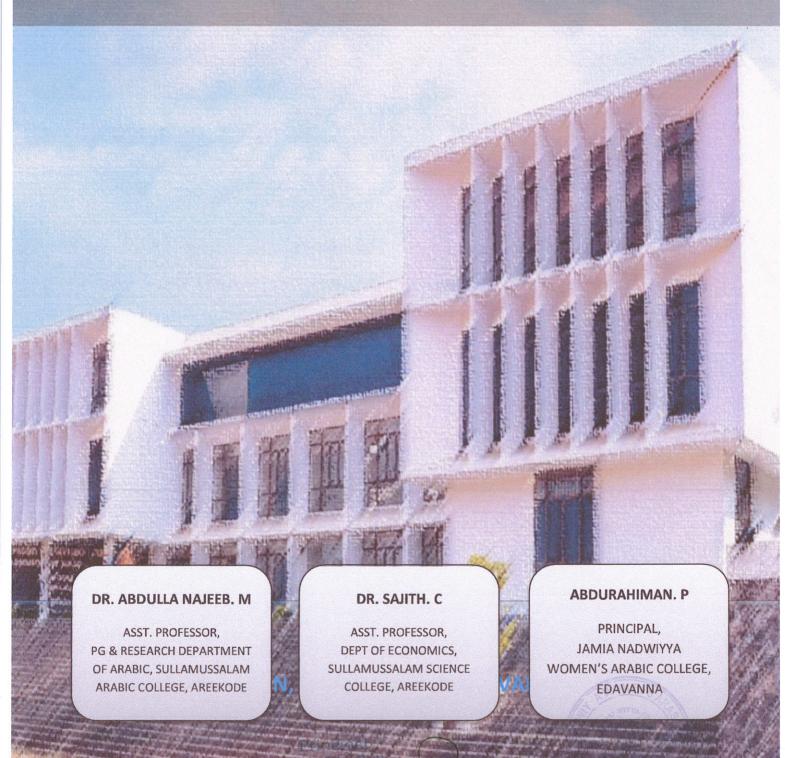

2. Interviews and Interactions

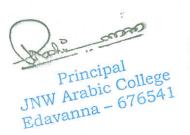
- Faculty, administrative staff, students, and alumni were interviewed to gather qualitative insights into the strengths and challenges faced by the institution.

- Offer more professional development opportunities for faculty and staff to foster growth.

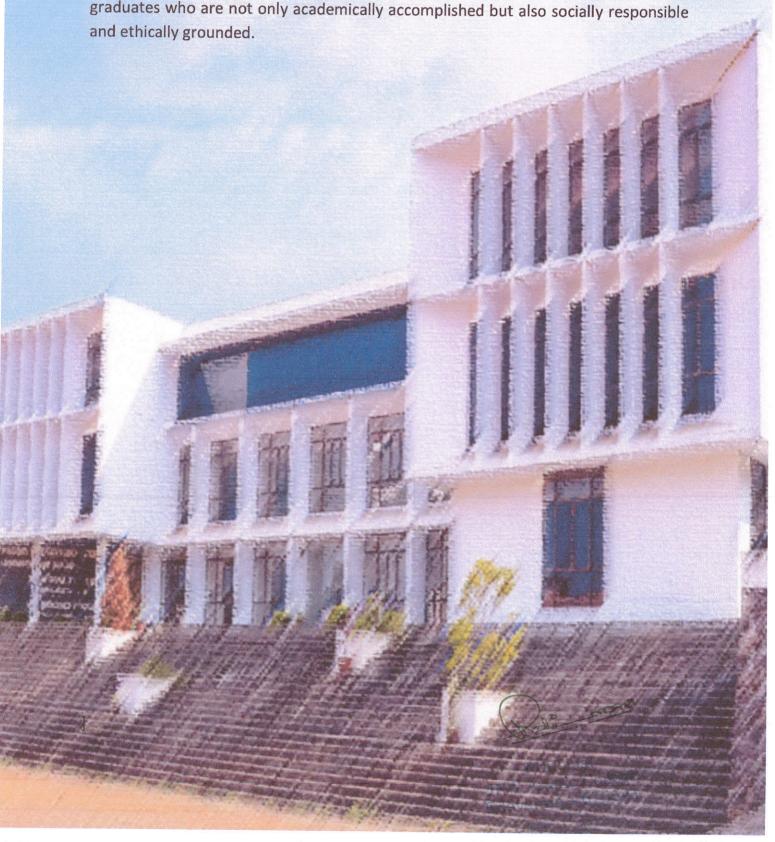
7. Institutional Values and Best Practices:
